Rotary International, the Resource Industry and Papua New Guinea

The Resource industry in PNG and our members put a lot of effort into helping PNG in remote areas in Health, Education and many other areas, with much needed support and service as well as our contributions to the government and economy of PNG.

The PNG Chamber of Mines and Petroleum have Teamed up with Rotary in Australia and PNG to donate medical and education supplies to PNG. Our Chamber is calling on support from our members to help us fund as many shipping containers as we can of medical and educational supplies to be donated to PNG.

Rotary through its Donations in Kind program Receives the Medical and educational Supplies in Australia and then via the Rotary Volunteers in Australia Pack and ship these containers to PNG where Rotary Volunteers in PNG unpack and Distribute these Medical and Education supplies to much needed areas of PNG.

Since its commencement nearly 30 years ago the Rotary Donations in Kind program has shipped nearly 700 containers to PNG and has spent over \$3 million AUD in Shipping and shipped about \$58 million in value of donated goods, areas regularly shipped to are Port Moresby, Lae, Rabaul, Madang, Wewak, Kimbe, Alotau, Lorengau, Manus Island and Boganville.

This Rotary Donation in Kind Program has delivered 8782 Hospital Beds, 3906 wheel chairs, 32, 230 school desks, 92,437 cartons of books and 85,933 cartons of medical supplies.

The cost to ship a 20 ft container is about \$5800 AUD and a 40ft container is about \$8500 AUD .

We are calling on our Members to join with us to either donate money towards the shipping more Donated Goods to PNG, and if you donate the value of a full container the container will be in your name, alternatively if you have your own shipping and Logistics you can choose to deliver the container to Donations in Kind in Brisbane and choose to ship, receive and distribute to your locally community.

We would like to get as much media coverage as possible for our members and the chamber via this initiative, to help people in remote areas that would otherwise may not receive much needed medical or educational support.

President of the Roger Hau'ofa Kidney Foundation (RHKF) Michelle Hau'ofa and PR & Media Engagement Lead Rachael Thomson visited the Rotary Donations In Kind Warehouse in Brisbane in late January 2021 and met with Patricia Dear, District Chair, Rotary Donations In Kind and Trevor Spall, Queensland Health's Director for Bio Technology Services.

Ms Dear has been instrumental in sourcing dialysis machines and other essential medical equipment for the Roger Hau'ofa Kidney Foundation and other health organisations in Papua New Guinea, and in building relationships in Queensland to support the RHKF in its efforts to address kidney health in PNG. Mr Spall specialises in dialysis machines and has been generous with his expertise on the benefits of the different machine models in the developing world context.

The four objectives of the RHKF are:

1. To promote healthy lifestyles as a means of preventing kidney disease;
2. To provide affordable, quality, accessible kidney treatments for our citizens;
3. To support kidney patients and their carers so they can access health care and make informed decisions with dignity and peace of mind;
4. To work collaboratively with all stakeholders in addressing kidney health issues in PNG.

The Foundation has embarked on kidney health awareness programs in PNG to support its first objective, and aims to bring dialysis machines to PNG and bring the cost of each treatment down to less than K50 per session to support its second objective. For this to be successful it will need strong partnerships around areas such as servicing of the machines, supply of consumables, and trained medical personnel, as well as committed funding from the government.

Ms Hau'ofa and Mrs Thomson also took the opportunity to meet with Rotary volunteers, many of whom are originally from PNG or have worked there in the past. Ms Hau'ofa spoke to the Rotarians about the objectives of the Foundation and how the work of the Rotarians directly impacts lives in PNG. Ms Hau'ofa thanked Ms Dear for supporting RHKF especially in connecting with key organisations in Queensland.
